

ISC Storm Soccer Club Covid Plan

There are several governing bodies that are defining requirements that sports teams must follow, and these requirements continue to evolve, Therefore rather

than attempt to restate the requirements we will look to accommodate the most restrictive of the following requirements. The documents below have been attached to this plan as the basis for the requirements this plan was based on.

- the Ohio Department of Health's Sports Order
- the Youth-Collegiate-Amateur-Club-Pro-Sports Document
- the Ohio South Youth Soccer Association's Return to Competition Mandates
- the Centerville Washington Park District Covid-19 Safety and Operations Plan.

The ISC Storm Covid Plan is based on a few common principles and guidelines.

- 1. Each coach or assistant coach will act as the compliance officer
- 2. The compliance officer will look to implement and or ensure that the guidelines defined within the documents referenced above are followed by.
 - a. Parents, Team Members, Spectators.

Social Distancing

The compliance officers will send the Ohio South Youth Soccer Association's Return to Competition Mandates and Guidelines, to all team parents. The Guideline outlines the requirements for social distancing and the various scenarios where the 6 feet requirements must be maintained... See Attached document for the requirements that the compliance officers will enforce or implement.



Social Distancing (Continued)

Both teams, including a maximum of three carded coaches as well as a carded
Director of Coaching per team, shall be stationed on opposite sides of the field and

all spectators shall remain on the same side of the field as their team's technical area.

- Each team will have a clearly marked technical area of social distancing size appropriate for their team.
 - This should be marked using cones or painted
 - Team area is to be on right when standing on side line at center of field facing the center circle and spectators are to be located on the left. Spectators will social distance
 6 feet minimum from the technical area and other spectators.
- Spectators shall be no closer to the field than 10 feet.
 - Spectators shall not be any closer than 10 feet from any corner flag.
 - If there are too many spectators a second row of spectators may be formed 6 feet behind the first row or be 6 ft. on the coach's side.
- During the match each coach shall remain on the side of the field assigned to that coach's team, and shall remain between a line (either marked or unmarked) from 10 yards from the center line to the top of the penalty area and 2 yards from the touch line.

The compliance officer will provide or require all team members and spectators to have readily available for use, hand sanitizer for any and all team events.

Venue Signage

Based on Centerville Washington Park District Covid-19 Safety and Operations Plan, (See attached), CWPD will provide signage to be placed at fields and facilities and to identify travel routes. ISC Storm team's will work with CWPD as to how best set up and remove signage as needed.

Enforcement

CWPD will manage the venue requirements per Centerville Washington Park District Covid-19 Safety and Operations Plan. The CWPD will have the contact information (Identified above) to communicate to either a specific Team Compliance officer or the Club Compliance Officer.



Safety Requirements for Sport to Practice or Compete.

Coaches / trainers/ participants will perform self-assessments and follow the guidelines found in the Ohio Department of Health's Sports Order to determine if

they should/can attend any team activity.

The director of the ISC Storm Soccer Club has created a Covid Education Letter (See attached) that has been sent to all parents, coaches, trainers and participates of the ISC Storm Soccer Club to help educate them on the virus and the steps required if they have come in contact or have contracted the virus.

Rules associated with Parents, Trainers, Spectators including the wearing of masks will be addressed by each coach by reviewing with the parents the Youth-Collegiate-Amateur-Club-Pro-Sports Document (See attached) and the rules outlined in the OSYSA Return to Competition web page located at https://www.osysa.com/safesoccer/rta/.

Regarding equipment, any shared equipment will be sanitized by the coach prior to every practice or game.

All field or venue requirements will be addressed by CWPD.

Process To Follow for a Possible or Confirmed Covid Case

Any team or club that has a confirmed or suspected COVID19 case must report it immediately to their Team Compliance Officer, Club Compliance Officer, County Health Department, and Soccer Leagues Compliance Officer.

All activities for a team with a confirmed or suspected COVID19 case shall be immediately suspended until return to play is approved. The League Compliance Officer may require player passes to be turned into the League office.

Examples included but not limited to are: training, scrimmages, games and tournaments.

The Team Compliance Officer/Coach will work with the Ohio Health Department to determine how to proceed with any action for the suspected/confirmed individual, team members and or participants.



Process to Follow for a Possible or Confirmed Covid Case (Continued)

The Team Compliance Officer/Coach will communicate the plan developed with the Ohio Health Department to the individual (if an Adult), Individuals parents (If a minor), Club Compliance Officer and League Compliance Officer

COVID19 return to play:

The Soccer league for the team will require written/electronic approval from the local Health Department / Individuals Physician in order for a team or anyone on the roster to receive consideration for return to play. The Soccer League will review the Health Department / Individual's Physician approval and any associated guidance by the Health Department / Individual's Physician to make the final determination as to when return to play is permitted and will do so in written or electronic form to the coach. If player passes were collected by the league office the team may retrieve the player passes during office hours.

Note Regarding This Plan

The documents and or web sites that are referenced in the ISC Storm Soccer Club Covid Plan may change over time and as such the Club Director will look to communicate to all compliance officers/parents and teams the changes in a timely manner.
