## A. Approval of Bills

Commissioner Monahan moved, Commissioner Pearl seconded, to authorize the February 2022 financial and investment activity. Commissioners Monahan, Pearl and Senney: ayes, motion carried.

### VI. BUSINESS

#### A. St. Leonard's Trail Contract

The 2022 CIP includes installation of a trail extension that will create a connection from Bill Yeck Park to Clyo Road, along the conservation easement adjacent to St. Leonard CHI Living Communities. Four bids were received for the project. The best, lowest, and most responsive bidder is Outdoor Enterprise, at \$142,471. Staff recommends awarding the project to Outdoor Enterprise for the bid amount plus a 5% contingency, for terrain improvements and unforeseen conditions, totaling \$150,000. This project is partially grant-funded by The OPWC Clean Ohio Program. The Park District will be reimbursed 75% of the total cost.

Commissioner Pearl moved, Commissioner Senney seconded, to approve a purchase order for \$150,000 for the installation of the Bill Yeck Trail extension. Commissioners Monahan, Pearl and Senney: ayes, motion carried.

## B. 2022 Mowing Contract

Four bids were submitted provide mowing services at 40 sites, totaling approximately 80 acres. The contract estimate was published at \$85,000. Having provided the best, lowest, and most responsive bid, staff recommends awarding a contract to Professional Property Maintenance, LLC. for \$80,000.

Commissioner Senney moved, Commissioner Pearl seconded, to approve a purchase order for \$80,000 to contract with Professional Property Maintenance to provide Lawn Care Services in parks in 2022. Commissioners Monahan, Pearl and Senney: ayes, motion carried.

## C. Dayton Foundation Committee Advised Field of Interest Fund Agreement

The Committee Advised Field of Interest fund is being established for the purpose of providing an avenue for donations to be used for improvements, enhancements and renovations for the Park District within Centerville and Washington Township.

Commissioner Pearl moved, Commissioner Monahan seconded, to approve the agreement between the Dayton Foundation and the Park District for the establishment of a Committee Advised Field of Interest Fund. Commissioners Monahan, Pearl and Senney: ayes, motion carried.
