This plan will not only enhance access to the park, but will improve the trails and amenities experience within the park for years to come. Park users will observe additional projects, large and small, also in progress.

New Playgrounds to Explore

Work to replace the **Yankee Park** playground began later than expected due to supply chain difficulties and weather conditions. We are excited to report the new playground is now back on track for completion in late April!

The new playground will feature an all-weather, all-accessible safety surface. It's easy to walk on, accommodates wheels, and is ready for use even immediately after the heaviest of downpours!

The Centerville Noon Optimist Club (CNO) generously donated \$25,000 to the playground project, allowing the Park District to enhance the community's chosen design with additional inclusive play equipment and shade structures. Play equipment additions made possible through the CNO donation include musical chimes, an ADA spinner, a turf mound and a Cozy Dome. In addition, the Centerville High School National Honor Society (NHS) donated \$3,000 to put toward the inclusive equipment! Thanks to the CNO and NHS for their dedication to the community's children! We hope this playground will become a community favorite!



In addition, **Black Oak Park** and **Willowbrook Park** (pictured at left) are both receiving new playgrounds, while **Donnybrook Park** and **Quail Run Park** are receiving some updated playground features. Take some time this summer to visit these new park amenities!

Oak Grove Awarded Environmental Facility Certification



The Centerville-Washington Park District was recently awarded a Sports Field Management Environmental Certified Facility Award for **Oak Grove Park**! The certification is awarded for demonstrating best management practices for environmentally sustainable sports facilities, including storm water management, turf management (mowing, fertilization, irrigation), integrated pest management, energy conservation and recycling/composting.

JUMP ON THE SUMMER CAMP FAST TRACK!

In an effort to improve your camp registration experience, we have created a way for you to fill out the required camp forms PRIOR to the first day of camp registration. This will make your camp registration go faster, and decrease the chance that your child will be placed on a camp waiting list. We will remind you when camp is open for registration!

STEP 1: Register your child for “2022 Forms Fast Track”

STEP 2: At checkout, complete the required Medical History Form and Authorized Pick-Up Form as instructed.

By registering for this fast track “program,” you will bypass the forms step during the camp checkout process!

Please note, this does NOT register your child for any camps. It simply serves as a way to expedite your camp registration by completing the required forms ahead of time. Additionally, Park District staff will be able to send you updates and reminders leading up to camp registration by using the list of those who have completed the forms.

If you do not take this step, you can complete the Medical History and Authorized Pick-Up forms during regular camp registration. However, the registration system will not hold the camps/programs in your “cart” or hold your child’s spot until all forms have been completed and payment is received.
