A. Sprayground Sponsorship Agreement

Commissioner Riley moved, Commissioner Senney seconded, to approve the sponsorship agreement between The Centerville-Washington Park District and Dayton Children's Hospital for the Sprayground Renovation project. Commissioners Pearl, Riley and Senney: ayes, motion carried.

B. Resolution of Necessity

Resolution to place a replacement question on the November 2023 ballot for the .9 Levy – Resolution 2023-05. Resolution has been reviewed by the Park District attorney. Upon approval, the Board's action will be recorded promptly with the County, as required by law.

C. 5/3 Bank Multi-Product Resolution 2023-06

Staff reviewed banking contract and found some changes that can be made to save money on bank fees. Among those, changing the accounts to non-interest bearing will save around \$112 per month. The accounts do not carry a high enough balance to earn interest. Should holding money at 5/3 ever become desirable, the accounts can be changed back. The Park District attorney has reviewed this document.

Commissioner Riley moved, Commissioner Senney seconded, to approve the 5/3 Bank Multi-Product Resolution (CWPD Resolution 2023-05). The Board further acknowledges that Chris Huff will sign the account-related documents. Commissioners Pearl, Riley and Senney: ayes, motion carried.

 - Inquired as to how volunteers will be recognized during National Volunteer Week
 - Inquired as to what staff learned from researching Ohioans with Disabilities
- Commissioner Senney
 - Inquired as to whether the Program Department partners with any local gyms (or similar, fitness-based, businesses)
- Commissioner Pearl
 - Brought up the idea of having ping-pong-related programs
 - Inquired as to whether we have offered a "history of the Park District" type of program
 - Mentioned that the OSU extension is promoting Victory Gardens and is passing out seed packets within the community (are we/should we partnering)



- Inquired as to whether we have reached out to the courts about programming for juvenile offenders, as we do for people with special needs
- Mentioned that the weather is getting nice and asked if we expect to see more police reports as the park traffic increases
